Strive to become individuals who inspire trust, not just admiration; who lead not merely with intellect, but with empathy.

I remain forever indebted to St. Mary's Convent — for it did not merely educate me; it refined me. It instilled in me a quiet confidence, the ability to stand tall yet remain grounded, to dream fiercely yet act gently. Every milestone I have crossed bears, in some measure, the invisible imprint of that sacred institution which taught me that excellence, when pursued with humility, becomes a form of gratitude.



